#### Happy May!

May is the month especially dedicated to our mother Mary. October belongs to our Lady in a special way as well, but October has a specific concentration on the rosary, whereas May is aimed directly at celebrating the glories of Mary. And what would we say those glories are exactly? Many things to be named, of course, but Holy Mother Church has specifically given us four. We call these the Four Dogmas of Mary. A dogma is a foundational belief that must be believed for salvation. If someone willfully and knowingly rejects a dogma of the Catholic Church, then that person cannot enter into heaven, because that person has rejected a truth provided by God. Having these truths gives us a greater appreciation and love of God.

The Four Dogmas of Mary are as follows.

<u>Immaculate Conception</u> - Mary was conceived without Original Sin. She had this unique privilege so that she could worthily be the mother of Jesus.

<u>The Mother of God</u> - She not only bore Christ's humanity, but really and truly bore the living God.

<u>Perpetual Virginity</u> - Mary was a virgin before, during and after the birth of Jesus.

(Incidentally, this, in one fell swoop, proves that Mary did not have any other children besides Jesus.)

<u>Assumption into Heaven</u> - Mary's body and soul have both been taken into heaven. In heaven she already enjoys the resurrection of the body. We will not have our body in heaven until the last judgment. This is a great gift to our mother, which further testifies to her great purity and sanctity.

I encourage you to truly have a Marian month this May! Increase your devotion to her by speaking to her often, praying the rosary and perhaps beginning the process of Consecration to Mary.

Mary loves us very much. Now let us strive to love her in return.
